I loved this book. As with previous Amulet books, the illustrations are wonderful and the story line continues to develop nicely. There are 3 things going on during this book that are brought together towards the end of the book. I continue to like how characters and the story is evolving. I wrote in a past review that time will tell, but so far I consider this to Bone-like in its breadth, depth, and overall quality. It also seems like the story will take at least 10 books to tell at its current pace. I think the author has suggested this much. My only 'disappointment' is that I waited 1 year for this book (pre-ordered in March) and finished it within an hour. That said, I know it takes a lot of effort to produce these books-- I follow the author's twitter and blog. I guess this is just a new experience for me. The story is captivating and possibly more important, is the art. Attention to detail, vibrant colours and imaginative creations. You root for the lead characters, Emily and Navin. Being so young but brave to go after their mother who has been taken by a octopus slash bug monster. The new world they discover will shock and awe them. To find out this place is hidden from the eyes of "our" world and that destruction can come to both. It is revealed to the kids by their great grandpa Silas, who sets them on this important mission. Character development is huge in this book series. The friends that go with Emily and Navin you will

cheer for. Miskit the rabbit, Cogsley the jerk robot and Leon the fox, bounty hunter. All important for Emily and Navin to complete their quest. I hope that book five is not the last of this book collection.
