Tall, Dark and Kilted is set in a castle in the Highlands, with a sexy laird, a spit fire heroine and his crazy family. It is a delightful story with all kinds of crazy twists and turns; interference at every turn from the family to add frustration and humor to the range of emotions suffered by the laird. It is a wonderful story of conflict, humor, frustration, plot twist and best of all love. For a first novel it is first rate ~ WOW!

I absolutely loved Lizzie Lamb's "Tall, Dark and Kilted." Great read! It is the British/Scottish version of 50 Shades of Grey but written much better. The main character (Fliss) isn't a pathetic twit and she actually has ambition and intelligence. It is enjoyable to get inside her head during the story and not at all annoying! The characters in this book seem so real and that put me on an emotional roller-coaster with them as I empathized with their situations. Tall, Dark, & Kilted by Lizzie Lamb was a fun read. It got off to a rough start, in my opinion, but once the story moved to Scotland, things picked up. It's about a woman who gets invited by some young, posh socialites to help their mother set up a "spa" type resort at their family home in Scotland.

I really enjoyed immersing myself in the Scottish highlands environment, it's characters fictional though they may be. I learned something new about Scotland as well as immensely liked the plot, the characters and how the heroine was portrayed as a strong person who knows how to stand for herself and that should be encouraged in chick lit! All in all it was like spending three days in a capsule full of love and green hills and hurts and misunderstanding and making up.

Set aside all the pulsating body dialogue, and you have a pretty good story. I enjoyed reading about Scotland, the customs and superstitions. Knowing nothing about the area, I am assuming that part of the book is factual. The spa business, however, seemed to be missing a knowledge of the managing of a spa and made all the other information seem a little suspect. I liked the central characters and felt they were well developed. I thought the ending very contrived...I guess for angst...but it made the story seem a little less believable. Why put someone through misery when you could have just explained what was going on? Anyway, you do find out what is under a man's kilt. Yes, I know the answer will really surprise you...not!

Tall, Dark and Kilted features a young British beauty therapist, Fliss, who ends up moving to a remote corner of the Scottish Highlands in order to work for the mother of her two spoiled, rich friends. Fliss is smart, talented and full of spunk. She has to stand up to the Laird of the property in order to keep her position managing his step-mother's therapy centre. After things get off to a bad foot, it's fun and exciting to watch them argue and bicker while sparks fly between them. The Laird's highly dysfunctional family makes things very interesting. It's dramatic and romantic and I recommend it to anyone who is already a fan of highlander romance, or of confident, strong heroines.

I have really enjoyed both books by Lizzie Lamb. TD&K had a slightly slower start, but it's so worth it. Once Fliss gets to Scotland, it's faster paced and interesting for multiple plot points. I kept stopping to look up things that are referenced that I hadn't heard of before (not being from Scotland) and I am glad I did. There were some very magical things. The romance is the center story, but the side plot of the beauty center and the supporting characters were equally interesting. You should definitely give this story a chance if you love British chicklit.
