

So what if that nerd is now a black-leather-jacket-wearing dreamboat, and his loner status is clearly the result of his troubled home life? Who cares if the right girl could help him with all that, maybe even save him from it . . . ? Logan. Who needs him when Jared Kline, the bad boy every girl dreams of, is asking her on dates? Who? Grade: FI picked up *ANATOMY OF A MISFIT* on an daily Kindle deal for \$1.99 and feel like I wasted my money. Anika does have a unique, sarcastic voice. She often sounds like a manic sixth grader rather than a high school sophomore. She’s judgmental (calls her best friend a slut), a follower (won’t say hi to a boy because her more popular friend might get mad), insensitive and unkind. Writer Andres Portes says in her dedication the novel is based on her ninth grade experiences. "I wrote the story because I wish I could go back in time and give this message to myself." Yikes. I certainly hope she didn’t base Anika on herself. I DNF, so maybe the story got

better, but when a story feels like fingernails on a chalkboard, it's time for me to give up.

No plot spoilers here. Easy, captivating read. If you aren't a young adult, this book will pull you back to those terrifying high school years when all that mattered was who you dated, what you wore, and who your best friends were. However, this one hits the reader right in the feels. The only negative thing I have to say (and hence the four stars) is some of the style in which the dialogue was written was too "young adult" for me. Like, really.

The book was humorous, relevant and deal it with real problems. It was refreshing to read a novel that was not mediocre. The heroine had a good attitude toward life and it's problems.

You have to read it. I laughed out loud....I loved...I hated.....and I cried. Remarkable book. I am making my kids read it. It's everything you wish you had the balls to say, do and stand for when you were young, but didn't. Get ready, Andrea. You're going to be WAY famous.
