

"The Local's Guide" is absolutely the truth. You get recommendations on where to park, how to use the shuttles to best advantage, and directions for scenic loop drives. This has similar content to Mr. Grubbs' other Grand Canyon guide, but without the pictures and the maps. This keeps the content quicker to load. There are links to the maps if you want them. I liked the photos in the bigger guide, giving me an idea what to expect in a given area, and whether I want to go there to take pictures, and if so, when. This guide gives you that information in text, but a picture is truly worth a thousand words. I believe both guides work well together. This is so useful during the trip because it's quick to look things up. I really appreciated that this one was also available on Kindle Unlimited.

This book is a very good mini-guide to the Grand Canyon with emphasis on finding the less traveled areas. I wish I would have had this book the last time my husband and I were at the Canyon. We could have used the ideas on where to go to escape the masses. There are suggestions on the best viewpoints, roads, and trails, as well as camping and lodging info, all mixed with a bit of history and geology. Simple and easy to use. It even has info on who to contact to get on a mule trip, how to keep the kids engaged, and photo tips.

This is a well written mini-guide with a wide range of information. I'd highly recommend it to anyone, especially if you are making your first excursion to the Grand Canyon. I bought it for ideas on a trip to the North Rim. Although many of the tips weren't news to me (I've a lot of experience hiking and kayaking in western national parks and wilderness areas) the information specific to the park was useful, and well worth the digital price.

While there is indeed a tremendous amount of detailed information provided by the author, this quick read is wonderful for giving you a great overview, and then providing links to get additional information to satisfy your own particular interests. Nicely done!!
