

I just finished reading The Land of Blue and I might have to read it again. It is so rich with metaphors and subtle messages, I want to make sure I pick up on every one of them! The story takes you on a great adventure filled with whimsy and life lessons all at the same time. At first, on the surface, it is a story filled with fun and fantasy, a bit like Willy Wonka's chocolate factory. But then you realize that too much of a good thing is not a good thing after all, and the inner workings of mental illness and addiction surface. Having a child with OCD and anxiety, this book is enlightening as to how her mind works and the constant struggle that goes on in her head over even the simplest of things. The story involves strength and courage and the strongest message of all, that we always have a choice.

This book is a gift that lifts you up and grabs you from the moment you pick it up until long after you put it down. Jill Sylvester creates The Land of Blue, an enthralling fantasia, that brilliantly unfolds into the human condition and the challenging issues of mental illness. The main character, Cassie,

takes us along on her journey into fantasy and adventure when she leaves her home and enters the Land of Blue in search of her happiness. The reader is compelled to rally for Cassie as she faces many obstacles including her ability to believe in herself. It is obvious that Jill Sylvester understands the complexity of the issues that the characters in the book have to deal with such as obsessional and compulsive thinking, anxiety, and addiction. These issues are presented with depth and sensitivity as well as an expectation for renewal. Cassie's adventure is filled with suspense, humor, insight, and vivid, whimsical imagery. Both the adult and young reader will relate to Cassie's worries and hopes as they discover how the thoughts that we have impact our lives. As a parent of two daughters, a professional working with children for many years, and as someone who really enjoys a great fantasy book, I would highly recommend the Land of Blue. I plan to purchase more copies as gifts for those who may be looking to discover another way to think about choice vs. fear and the power that they can discover in the Land of Blue.
