

Tim Nelson is an aerospace engineer living in the Seattle area. This book, his first, resulted from his fascination with the long, rich history of flight in this faraway corner of the United States.

As a Northwest native and aviation enthusiast I found this book fascinating. The author has an unusual take for an aviation history. Instead of technical details and histories of the aircraft, he focuses on the places these planes flew (and the people who built and flew them) in what he calls "aviation archaeology." When I first looked through it, I skimmed over the parts I thought most

interesting but I quickly became enthralled by the stories and the engaging and concise writing style - no dry, boring text here! I did a quick "rewind" myself and read the book cover to cover. In addition to the fascinating stories, I appreciated the inclusion of street addresses, web sites, phone numbers and recommendations for these historic locations, so the book not only makes an excellent read, but a great guide book for travels throughout the Northwest. No matter where you live, if you or a friend are interested in aviation history this book will be a must read and a wonderful gift (I'm buying a copy for a friend in Virginia!).

This gorgeously written and crafted book is a must-have for aviation history enthusiasts. The photos, maps and text are perfectly chosen and informative, providing interesting background details of area airports, whetting one's appetite for further exploration in person using the tips provided. The author gives us a unique window into the important and pervasive role aviation has played in the Pacific Northwest by showing us the actual locations of airports big and small, then and now that gave birth to the region's love of flying machines and the people who dared launch them into the air (and sometimes, sadly, crashed them into the ground). Over time i learned of more aviation related companies that are associated with the region, museums, locations etc. Until i read Mr. Nelson's book I did not realize that i barely scratched the surface on the aviation history in the area. This book is a must have for all those that live in the Pacific North West. Keep a copy in your car, pull up

a page to the area you want to go explore and have fun!
