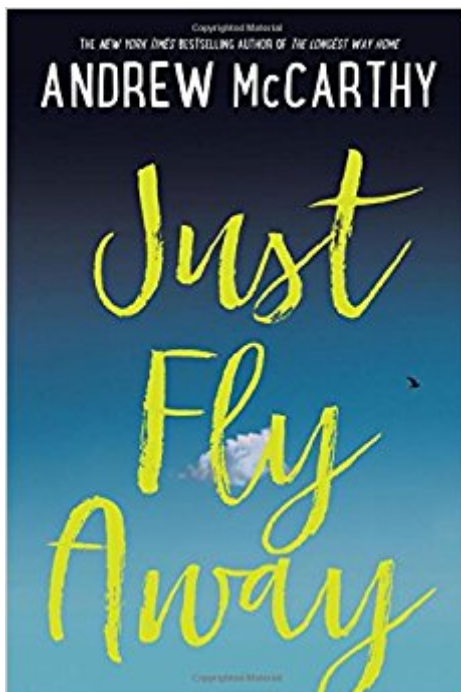


The book was found

I loved this book. I had been looking forward to it coming out as I was curious about how Andrew McCarthy's YA novel would be after having read his memoir. And I really enjoyed it. It is an absolute page-turner about a teenage girl who finds out a secret about her father. I don't want to spoil what happens but it really made me understand something about my own teenage years and how I used to react to situations with my father and my brothers. It made me see all of that in a whole new light.

Honestly, I hope Mr. McCarthy puts out a sequel to this book, as I am curious about Lucy's healing process and the dynamics of her family. If I make it to a book talk, I am definitely going to ask that question. As far as downsides, I think Mr. McCarthy referring to the "shore" as opposed to the beach may have bewildered some people, as "The Shore" is a very regional term for those who live near or in New Jersey (as I do). I certainly enjoyed the book and loved the references to Journey and Bruce Springsteen (as classic rock...am I that old?), especially Journey given their induction into the R&R Hall of Fame. All in all, I enjoyed the book, which allowed me to wonder how I would feel if I were Lucy and if the family secret devastates the family once they were reunited.

I absolutely loved this book. After beginning it, I could not put it down! The story about a young girl finding a family secret is incredibly witty, engaging and thoughtful. The voice of the rebellious yet still naive teenager is perfectly captured in the beautiful writing and makes the story even more relatable. I am so excited to recommend this book to everyone I know, especially teenage friends of mine who I am sure will connect to the many coming-of-age themes that run throughout the novel.

I definitely have a new favorite author now. I had never read any of Andrew's work prior to this book and I fell in love with his style.
